CDAP Inpatient Psychiatry Unit Features

- This Inpatient Program provides crisis stabilization for people who require medical detoxification from alcohol or drugs or who have a co-occurring disorder psychiatric condition that needs to be stabilized.
 - The Institute of Psychiatry is a JCAHO-accredited, secure, locked unit with a fixed therapeutic schedule.
 - The inpatient setting provides evaluation, medical management, behavioral treatment, occupational therapy, recreation therapy, patient and family education and planning for care after discharge.
 - Thorough evaluation is provided by a highly skilled, multidisciplinary treatment team, including attending physician, nurses, therapeutic assistants and social workers.
 - The average length of stay is 3-7 days, although the actual length of stay is determined by an individual's physical, mental and emotional stability
- CDAP's alcohol and substance abuse treatment philosophy encompasses a variety of highly effective biological, psychological and social interventions
 - 24-hour in-house physician coverage
 - Extensive physician time with patients and families, under close supervision by attending physician
 - Consultation with MUSC world-class physician specialists with access to medical tests if needed
 - Fixed schedule of individual and group sessions
 - Relapse prevention, AA/NA Meetings onsite
 - MUSC CDAP's Charleston Alcohol Research Center is one of only 15 National Institutes of Health funded alcohol research centers
 - Internationally recognized for discoveries and advanced treatments including brain imaging, genetics and behavioral pharmacology

Patient Profile

- History of alcohol or substance dependence or abuse
- At risk of harming self or others
- May have a co-occurring psychotic disorder (paranoia and/or hallucinations)
- Experiencing:
 - Increased depression, isolation, anxiety, fearfulness or confusion
 - Changes in sleep or appetite or ability to perform ADLs
- Refusing medications or treatment
- 18-plus years old
